

Director's Notes

A Long Time Ago...in a context far, far, away...

It is a period of civil war.

By 44 B.C. the the triumvirate of Caesar, Crassus, and Pompey has fractured.

Roman legions, striking from a hidden base in Spain have won their final victory against their enemies the Optimates — thereby putting an end to the first triumvirate— and starting the decline that eventually replaces the Roman republic, with the Empire.

Emerging victorious in the war, Julius Caesar is politically able to return in triumph to Rome unopposed, and govern as the elected Dictator Perpetuo — Dictator in perpetuity. Which to some meant — Dictator for life...

A rebellion is born — seeking to ensure that no single individual be named king, thus reverting hundreds of centuries of Roman history when tyrannical monarchs ruled, enslaved, and executed millions.

Rebels against the Empire.

Subsequently, the assassination of Julius Caesar and the war that followed, began the Republican decline that led to the Roman Empire, initiated with the reign of the Roman Emperor Augustus. (Octavius Caesar — nephew of Julius)

Right around that same time, Weezer released the 1st of their 13 albums.

Musically rebellious and sublimely prolific, the band transcends genre labeling due to the depth and breadth of its exploration. The ubiquitous funk-pop-rock-songs like *Buddy Holly, Undone*, and *Hashpipe* that have been radio mainstays for 20 + years, are the icing on a glorious cake of emotional discovery, ethereal escape, and thoughtful delight — evident in songs like, *Greatest Man That Ever Lived, Unspoken, Haunt you Everyday*, and many more.

Not to mention the music's ability to incite the ferocity of dancing with an overbite.

The pairing was an obvious 'title-first-and-build-from-there' approach — but once ensconced in the Shakespearian story and the Weezer catalogue it was soon apparent that this could potentially be a four-hour-show.

With SO much great Weezer music to help tell the tale, give emotional lift to scenes, and reveal character, it was a joyous process to discover and dovetail story and song. They even wrote a tune called. *Cleopatra*.

The musical rebels of Weezer meet the Shakespearean rebels of Julius Caesar — and the good news is...we got it under four hours.

RICK BATALLA (Decius, Lucius) is an award winning performer, writer, and director for television, film and theater, and a founder of The Troubadour Theater company.

Rick studied with the creator of The Groundlings in Los Angeles, and The Second City. He has

been a series regular in shows like CBS's Payne,

ABC's *True Love* and TBS's *Dinner and A Movie*, where he also wrote and directed. He has guest starred on many TV shows including *Hollywood Darlings*, *Cold Case*, and *Liv and Maddie*.

Rick also writes original musicals. He wrote the multi-Ovation nominated "CHiPs the Musical" and "Blake...Da Musical" which won the Ovation for 'Best New Musical'. He currently has two shows in preproduction. The first is *Lucretia*...*King Slayer*, and the other is titled *Eulogy*.
